3. Go to a stable, horse show, or farm and see how horses are groomed and cleaned before riding or working. While there, help clean saddles, bridles, and the barn area.
4. Cut pictures out of magazines and newspapers to make a collage of horses.
5. Discuss making a donation to your local SPCA to go toward hay for their horses or donkeys. Vote to donate money from troop funds.
6. Have someone talk to your troop about the way horses helped in developing our country (transportation, farming, communication, and sport).
