

Tips for Submitting Great Award Nominations

Help make sure your candidate receives the recognition they deserve.

- Look through the Adult & Girl Recognitions Summary booklet (#4053) to see what is available.
- Check to see if the award has a deadline, not all do but <u>some</u> are due by <u>October 31.</u>
- Keep in mind the award criteria and match the award to the candidate's service.
- Check to see what awards the candidate may have previously received.
- A list of past award recipients is on the GSVSC website.
- Be specific, details are important.
- Name or list activities, events, etc., who benefited from her/his actions, dates and duration.
- List above & beyond aspects. Expectations of the position are not considered above & beyond.
- Avoid generalizations such as, "she gives 110% " or "she has done every job in Girl Scouts".
- Remember there is no progression in awards (exception is the Thanks Badge II).
- The nominator may <u>not</u> write a letter of support.
- If the nomination requires 2 letters of support, there must be 3 people involved.
- Letters of support may be needed from other service units or regions (Council map on page 3).
- Letter of support writers should give supporting data, not copy the nominators statement.
- Only information contained in the nomination and letters of support will be considered.
- Submit nomination and letters of support together in one packet if at all possible.
- Please allow enough time for processing. Nominations are sent to recognitions committee members throughout the council for review.
- Some awards also require board approval. In that case a summary of the nominations along with the committees' recommendation is forwarded to the GSVSC Board of Directors.
- The nominator will be notified when a decision has been made.

A Quick Look at the GSUSA National Awards

Girl Scout Adult Highest Achievement Awards

- Appreciation Pin- candidate's exemplary service impacts one service unit
- Honor Pin- candidate's exemplary service impacts two or more service units
- Thanks Badge- candidate's exemplary service impacts entire council or entire Girl Scout movement
- Thanks Badge II- candidate's continuing service benefits the entire Girl Scout movement
- Volunteer of Excellence- candidate's exemplary service working directly with girls in any pathway <u>or</u> indirectly in support of the council's mission delivery (variety of ways) to girls & adults
- **President's Award-** service team, committee, or volunteer team that has an impact on council goals
- Juliette Gordon Low World Friendship Medal- individuals/councils empower girls to be global citizens

GSUSA Girl Lifesaving Awards

- **Bronze Cross** presented when a girl has shown special heroism or faced extraordinary risk of her own life to save another's life or an attempt to save another life.
- **Medal of Honor** presented for gallantry in saving a life or attempting to save a life without considerable risk to a girl's life.



Awards Exclusive to Girl Scouts of Virginia Skyline Council (GSVSC)

- Skyline Rising Star Award- candidate is new to Girl Scouts (less than 3 yrs) but has made a big impact
- Hidden Heroine/Hidden Hero Award- someone who helps setup, clean up, always is there to help
- Skyline Star Service Unit Award- service team that maintains/promotes growth in their service unit
- Becky Shaffer Owl Award- council trainer that exhibits exceptional attentiveness in her/his duties
- Service to Volunteers Award- GSVSC employee gives outstanding service benefitting 2 + service units
- Special Service Award- adult, business, organization/corporation with distinguished service on GS task
- Council Plaque- adult, business, organization/corporation has given 10 years of outstanding service
- Skyline Hall of Fame- adult member for at least 25 years who provided service with long lasting impact
- **GSVSC Living Donor Award-** a Girl Scout who gave a living donation in a effort to save or prolong a life
- Emergency Preparedness Award- girls & adults who exhibit concern for others' safety in extreme crisis
- Tracy & Thelma Loyd Conservation Award- troops/groups or individuals with outstanding service in the field of conservation

- Years of Adult Service Pin- for total number of years of service as an active, registered adult volunteer in Girl Scouting

- Skyline Star Troop Award- a troop that has a well rounded troop program

- Applications accepted anytime.

Skyline Star Leader Award

Recognizes a troop leader for completion of requirements for membership and leadership.

- May be given at any time.
- Applications accepted anytime.

Skyline Star Service Unit Award

Recognizes a service team for maintaining and promoting growth of Girl Scouting in their area.

- Presented at the annual meeting.
- Requires approval of council recognitions committee
- Nominations must be received by October 31.
- Timeframe for service is October 1 to September 30.

Skyline Hall Of Fame

Recognizes an adult who has been an adult member for at least 25 years, delivered service that far exceeds the expectation of any position, that has a lasting impact on the Girl Scout organization or her/his service unit. Award may be awarded posthumously.

- Presented at the annual meeting.
- Requires approval of the board of directors.
- Nominations must be received by October 31.

- 1. current or former registered Girl Scout adult member, staff or volunteer;
- 2. in good standing with the council;
- 3. was/has been an adult member at least 25 years;
- 4. provided service that has had/will have a long lasting impact on Girl Scout organization.
- Four or more additional letters of support must accompany the nomination.

GSVSC Awards for Troops/Groups, Service Teams, & Individuals

Skyline Rising Star Award

Recognizes the service of an individual who is new to Girl Scouts and has hit the ground running. This volunteer has been with Girl Scouts for a short time but has made a big impact on her/his troop or service unit, fully embraced the Girl Scout movement with energy and passion, and has performed outstanding work in their first three years.

- May be given at any time
- Requires approval of the council recognitions committee

Criteria:

- 1. active registered adult Girl Scout and completed required training for the position;
- 2. volunteered for less than three years with a troop or group;
- 3. participated in at least one service unit or council event or program;
- 4. attended or had a proxy attend local service unit meetings;
- 5. implements the Girl Scout Leadership Experience within troop/group programming;
- 6. girls in troop/group participated in the Girl Scout Product Sales;
- 7. troop/group has been kept open to new members.
- Two additional letters of support must accompany the nomination (if possible one from a girl in the troop)
- Nomination form #2364 Letter of support form #4065
- Send to the Council Recognitions Committee

Hidden Heroine Award/Hidden Hero Award

Recognizes the efforts of an adult volunteer who embodies the Girl Scout principle to *help where needed.* This person may be the one who comes early and stays late at meetings, events etc. to help set up and clean up without being asked or is available to provide over and above assistance to special projects, ongoing tasks, and support of Girl Scout programs and

continually accept assignments in order to keep Girl Scouting thriving.

- May be given at any time
- Requires approval of the council recognitions committee

- 1. candidate is an active, registered adult Girl Scout;
- 2. has a history or reputation of always being there when needed, picking up the slack, stepping in at the last moment, or volunteering for additional assignments/responsibilities;
- 3. demonstrated her/his commitment to Girl Scouting by continually working to provide the best possible experience for girls or adults;
- 4. whose outstanding service has had a positive impact on Girl Scouting.
- Two or more additional letters of support must accompany the nomination.
- Nomination form #2363 Letter of support form #4065
- Send to the Council Recognitions Committee





GSVSC Awards for Troops/Groups, Service Teams, & Individuals

Tracy & Thelma Loyd Conservation Award

Recognizes Girl Scout troops/groups or individuals who have given outstanding service in the field of conservation.

- Presented at the annual meeting.
- Requires approval of the board of directors.
- Applications must be received by October 31.

CRITERIA:

- 1. registered troop or member of Girl Scouts;
- 2. project must benefit Girl Scouts or the community;
- 3. project must be completed/finished.
- Two additional letters of support must accompany the application.
- Application form #4057A Letter of support form #4057B
- Send to the Council Recognitions Committee



Becky Shaffer Owl Award

Recognizes individuals who provide outstanding training that exceeds the expectations of the position and exhibits exceptional attentiveness in performing her/his training duties. Performance as a council trainer is so outstanding in nature that it merits recognition.

The Owl refers to the wise nature of a Girl Scout trainer.

- May be given at any time
- Requires approval of the council recognitions committee

- 1. active, registered adult Girl Scout and has successfully completed required training for the position and is considered a trainer in good standing;
- 2. served as a trainer for a minimum of three years and attended two in person Trainers Conferences in the last three years;
- 3. shown outstanding training to adults and/or girls in Girl Scouts, and actively understands and practices the values of inclusive behavior;
- 4. service and training provided exceeds the expectations for the position in at least three of the following areas: teamwork, versatility, enthusiasm, creativity, attitude, leadership, communication, and dedication.
- Two or more additional letters of support must accompany the nomination.

Awards for Service on a GSVSC Task/Project or Volunteer Support

Special Service Award

Recognizes distinguished, dedicated service while working on a special GSVSC project or task.

- Presented at the annual meeting.
- Requires approval of the board of directors.
- Nominations must be received by October 31.

CRITERIA:

- 1. may be any registered adult member of Girl Scouts (volunteer or staff), business, corporation, organization, or nonregistered adult friend of Girl Scouting;
- 2. must have performed a superior service to GSVSC.
- Three additional letters of support must accompany the nomination.
- Nomination form #4058 Letter of support form #4065
- Send to the Council Recognitions Committee



Service to Volunteers Award

Recognizes outstanding service of a GSVSC employee that is above and beyond the expectations of the position held and benefits more than two service units.

- Presented at the annual meeting.
- Requires approval of the board of directors.
- Nominations must be received by October 31.

CRITERIA:

- 1. must be an active member of the Girl Scouts of Virginia Skyline Council staff for a minimum of two years at the time of nomination;
- 2. service given is consistently outstanding and above the expectations of the position held;
- 3. service described should reflect a commitment to the Girl Scout mission and provide documentation of attention to implied or expressed needs of volunteers;
- 4. outstanding service to volunteers in any area, including membership, training, program, public relations, business functions, fundraising, or property management, will be considered;
- 5. service must be of direct benefit to volunteers in reaching the Girl Scout mission.
- Three additional letters of support from two or more service units must accompany the nomination.

Recognition for Years of Membership & Service

Membership Numeral Guard

Recognizes the total number of girl and adult registration years in Girl Scouting.

- Available in five-year increments.
- May be given at any time.
- Does not require approval of the council recognitions committee.
- Numeral guard will be provided by GSVSC.
- Numeral guards 20 years or more will be presented at the annual meeting if requested.

Years of Adult Service Pin

Recognizes the total number of years of service as an active, registered adult volunteer in Girl Scouting.

- Available in five-year increments.
- May be given at any time.
- Does not require approval of the council recognitions committee.
- Pins will be provided by GSVSC.
- Pins for 20 years or more will be presented at the annual meeting if requested.
- Application Form #4050
- Send to info@gsvsc.org

Council Plaque

Recognizes 10 or more years of outstanding service to Girl Scouts.

- Presented locally by the nominator.
- Requires approval of the board of directors.
- Nominations must be received by October 31.

CRITERIA:

- 1. may be any registered adult member of Girl Scouts (volunteer or staff); business, corporation, organization, or nonregistered adult friend of Girl Scouting;
- 2. must have performed longtime superior service.
- Three additional letters of support must accompany the nomination.
- Nomination form #4060 Letter of support form #4065
- Send to the Council Recognitions Committee







Emergency & Lifesaving Awards for Adults and Girls

GSVSC Emergency Preparedness Award

Honors girls & adults who exhibit a concern for others' safety in an extreme crisis situation.

- May be given at any time.
- Requires approval of the council recognitions committee
- Nominations must be received within 60 days of the emergency event.

CRITERIA:

- 1. registered girl or adult member of Girl Scouts;
- 2. actions performed were beyond the age, maturity, training of the nominee and saved or attempted to save the life of a person.
- Nomination form #4062 Send to the Council Recognitions Committee

GSVSC Living Donor Award

Honors a Girl Scout who gives the ultimate gift of a living donation in an effort to save a life.

- May be given at any time.
- Requires approval of the council recognitions committee
- Nominations should be received within 12 months of the donation **CRITERIA:**
- 1. registered girl or adult member of Girl Scouts at the time of the living donation;
- 2. gives a living donation of a kidney or part of a liver, lung, Intestine, pancreas, or bone marrow to another person either as a living related donation, a living unrelated donation or a non-directive or altruistic donation;
- 3. action saved or enhanced /prolonged the life of a person.

GSUSA Lifesaving Awards for Girls

Girl Scouts of the USA can formally recognize any registered girl member who has saved or attempted to save human life under circumstances that indicate heroism or the risk of her own life.

- May be given at any time.
- Requires approval of the council recognitions committee
- Application should be requested within 60 days of the incident, & completed application must be submitted within six months after the incident occurred.

CRITERIA:

- 1. registered girl member of Girl Scouts;
- 2. actions performed are beyond the degree of maturity and training to be expected at the nominee's age;
- 3. application must be accompanied by a personally signed statement from the rescuer, the rescued person, and the witnesses (at least 2 but not more than 3);
- 4. Recognition cannot be given to anyone who caused or contributed to the accident or anyone who has taken the risk merely in the performance of duty.

GSUSA Awards for Troops/Groups, Service Teams, & Individuals

Volunteer of Excellence Award

Recognizes volunteers who contributed outstanding service while partnering directly with girls in any pathway to implement the Girl Scout Leadership Experience or who contributed outstanding service in support of the council's mission delivery to girl and adult members.

- May be given at any time
- Requires approval of the council recognitions committee

Criteria:



- 1. candidate is an active, registered adult Girl Scout and has successfully completed a term of service and all requirements for the position;
- 2. performed beyond expectations for the position to deliver the GSLE to girls using the national program portfolio,
- 3. <u>or</u> performance has been beyond the expectations of the position and has supported the council's mission-delivery goals in one or more of the following functional areas: Membership Development/ Community Cultivation, Volunteer Relations & Support, Program, Leadership & Governance, Fund Development, Council Support Service (such as IT, Customer Service, Merchandising, MarComm);
- 4. actively recognizes, understands, and practices the values of inclusive behavior.
- Two additional letters of support must accompany the nomination (at least one from an adult)
- Nomination form #4196 Letter of support form #4065
- Send to the Council Recognitions Committee

President's Award

Recognizes the efforts of a service team, committee, or volunteer team whose exemplary service in support of delivering the Girl Scout Leadership Experience surpassed team goals and resulted in significant, measurable impact toward reaching the council's overall goals.

- May be given at any time
- Requires approval of the council recognitions committee

- 1. all service team members are registered Girl Scouts;
- 2. all service team members have met all requirements and expectations of the positions held;
- 3. service delivery team has significantly contributed to meeting one or more of the council's missiondelivery goals;
- 4. service delivery team reflects the diversity of the target audience or area it serves, in girl and adult membership, in all pathways offered;
- 5. Service delivery team actively recognizes, understands, practices the values of inclusive behavior.
- Two additional letters of support must accompany the nomination

GSUSA Awards for Service Impacting One or More Geographic Areas

Appreciation Pin

Recognizes an individual's exemplary service in support of delivering the Girl Scout Leadership Experience. This service, which has had measureable impact on one geographic area of service (service unit), helps reach and surpass the mission-delivery goals of the area.

- Presented at the annual meeting.
- Requires approval of the board of directors.
- Nominations must be received by October 31.

Criteria:

- 1. candidate is an active, registered adult Girl Scout (volunteer or staff);
- 2. service performed by the candidate is above and beyond the expectations for the position held and made an impact on a service unit within the council's jurisdiction.
- Two or more additional letters of support must accompany the nomination.
- Nomination form #4056 Letter of support form #4065
- Send to the Council Recognitions Committee

Honor Pin

Recognizes an individual's exemplary service in support of delivering the Girl Scout Leadership Experience, which has had measurable impact on two or more geographic areas of service, (service units) allowing the council to reach and surpass its mission-delivery goals.

- Presented at the annual meeting.
- Requires approval of the board of directors.
- Nominations must be received by October 31.

- 1. candidate is an active, registered adult Girl Scout;
- 2. service performed is above and beyond the expectations for the position held and made an impact on two or more service units within the council jurisdiction;
- Three additional letters of support from two or more service units and/or a region must accompany the nomination.
- Nomination form #4059 Letter of support form #4065
- Send to the Council Recognitions Committee





Thanks Badge

Honors an individual whose ongoing commitment, leadership, and service have had an exceptional, measurable impact on meeting the mission-delivery goals and priorities of the entire council or the entire Girl Scout Movement. Most prestigious award presented in Girl Scouting.

- Presented at the annual meeting.
- Requires approval of the board of directors.
- Nominations must be received by October 31.

Criteria:

- 1. candidate is an active, registered adult Girl Scout;
- 2. outstanding service performed resulted in outcomes that benefitted the total council or the entire Girl Scout organization, and is so significantly above and beyond the call of duty that no other award would be appropriate.
- Four letters of support from three or more regions of the council must accompany the nomination.
- Nomination form #4061 Letter of support form #4065
- Send to the Council Recognitions Committee

Thanks Badge II

The Thanks Badge II honors a previous Thanks Badge award recipient who has continued to provide exemplary service in a leadership role, resulting in a measurable impact that benefits the entire Girl Scout Movement.

- Presented at the annual meeting.
- Requires approval of the board of directors.
- Nominations must be received by October 31.

- 1. The candidate is an active, registered adult Girl Scout;
- 2. The candidate has received the Thanks Badge;
- 3. The outstanding service performed by the candidate resulted in outcome(s) that benefitted the entire Girl Scout organization, and is so significantly above and beyond the call of duty that no other award would be appropriate.
- Four letters of support from three or more regions of the council must accompany the nomination.
- Nomination form #4064 Letter of support form #4065

The Juliette Gordon Low World Friendship Medal

The Juliette Low World Friendship Medal is awarded to individuals and councils who have enriched and leveraged the global understanding of Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting to grow responsible global citizens. This prestigious national award is approved by the Girl Scouts of the USA National Board of Directors.





Criteria:

- **Impact on girls:** Nominee's efforts include girl involvement resulting in increased opportunities for girl-led global opportunities and Take Action project resulting in significant global impact.
- **Commitment:** Nominee has demonstrated dedication and commitment over a significant amount of time by continuously promoting and expanding the global dimension of Girl Guiding/Girl Scouting and has promoted the Juliette Low World Friendship fund or other global Girl Scouting funding opportunities.
- **Global awareness:** Nominee has created and promoted resources and opportunities that increase the understanding of the global dimension of Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting to the council and the larger community.
- Leadership: Nominee is recognized by girl and adult members, and the larger community, as a leader who leverages the global impact of Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting.
- **Membership:** Nominee is a current registered Girl Scout adult member in a council or USA Girl Scouts Overseas.


Nomination Process A Girl Scout council or individual nominates a candidate or council that meets all the criteria and has not previously received this award. A GSUSA nomination form is to be completed in full and submitted along with two letters of endorsement describing how the nominee meets the criteria for the award.

Nominations may be submitted at any time by mailing the nomination form and endorsement letters to the Vice President of Global Girl Scouting at the address provided on the form. The nomination is presented to the International Commissioner for review. Final approval is by the GSUSA National Board of Directors. Upon approval, the Vice President of Global Girl Scouting will coordinate the presentation of the award to the nominee. Check with council for more information.



Earned award pins are worn above the ID pin, up near the shoulder on the right side of the Adult uniform. Other volunteer recognition pins such as the Volunteer age level pins can be worn below the ID pin on the right side. If an adult has earned more than one special recognition (e.g. Appreciation Pin), the last one received is generally the one worn on the uniform.


